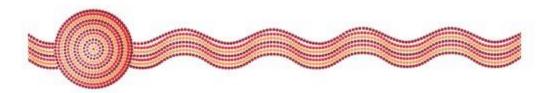

Unit 1 AOS 2 Specific changes

- Youth health and wellbeing now Area of Study 2
- Equity and social justice
- Language changes to facilitate analysis
 - data <u>such as incidence</u>, prevalence and trends
 - Health focus
 - using research to interpret data
- Research focus areas included





Unit 1 AOS 3 Specific changes

- Explicit nutrients <u>such as</u> carbohydrates (including fibre), fats, proteins, water, vitamin C, vitamin D, iron, calcium, sodium and folate
- Health outcomes instead of health and wellbeing
- Commercial factors





Assessment

- a written report such as a media analysis, a research investigation, a blog post or a case study analysis
- an extended response question analysing a range of data sources with an emphasis on annotating, synthesising and planning the response
- a visual presentation, such as a graphic organiser, a concept/mind map, an annotated poster or a digital presentation
- an **oral presentation**, such as a debate or a podcast
- structured questions, including data analysis.
