

# SHAPE YOUR VCE

with VET subjects that feel like you

## BLOCK CREDIT RECOGNITION IN THE VCE

If you wish to pursue a VET certificate that is not included as part of the VCE VET offering you can still receive credit towards your VCE or VCE VM. This is called block credit recognition.

### CREDIT TOWARDS THE VCE OR VCE VM

The credit you may receive towards your VCE or VCE VM depends on the certificate level and the total number of nominal hours<sup>1</sup> for the Units of Competency (UoCs)<sup>2</sup> you've completed. For each VCE unit, you must complete 90 nominal hours of UoCs at Certificate II level or above.

#### CERTIFICATE II

You can receive up to 6 units of credit at VCE Units 1 and 2 level only.

#### CERTIFICATE III

You can receive up to 6 units of credit at VCE Units 1 to 4 level.

#### CERTIFICATES IV AND ABOVE

You can receive up to 4 units of credit at VCE Units 3 and 4 level only.

## CALCULATE YOUR CREDIT

The chart below shows the VCE credit you may receive, based on the certificate level and total nominal hours of completed UoCs.
